<p>Marc Albano Governor</p>	<p>Marc Albano has been a governor at CCHSG since July 2012 and is Chair of the Personnel Committee.</p> <p>Marc is the Deputy Director of Finance at the University of Essex, responsible for managing Business Systems and Major Projects within the University's Finance Section. He previously worked in various Local Government organisations during which time he gained experience of Private Finance Initiatives (PFIs) and public-private partnerships in general.</p> <p>A qualified member of the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA), Marc studied Accountancy at Anglia Polytechnic.
